Highway jobs outlining stone surfacing and maintenance work in three counties were approved by Gov. Rennebohm Wednesday.

The projects:

Oconto county—14 miles state highway 32 between Suring and Mountain; with Elmer Hubbard of Suring, \$21,424.

Vernon county—6.3 miles state 131 between LaFarge and Rockton; Ed Muller, LaFarge, \$14,930.

Trempealeau county—14.9 miles state 93 between Arcadia and Elk Creek; Neuheisel Limestone Products Co., Eau Claire, \$5,040.
