"Leave It to Joan," KTSA, 9 p. m.—Premiere of a new summer series at this time starring Joan Davis.

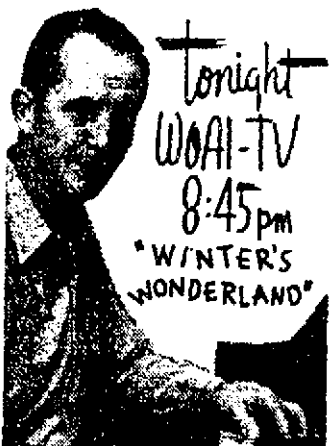
