## Zion Lutheran Church to Observe 50th Anniversary

The Zion Lutheran church, 247 Division st., will observe its 50th anniversary Sunday with outdoor services, and a picnic in Burrows park, according to the Rev. F. Paul Splett, pastor.

A feature of the service, starting at 11 a. m., will be the presentation of persons who participated in outstanding events in the church's 50-year history.

Among those who will be present will be several charter members of the church, the first persons to be baptized in the church, the first confirmation class, the first couple married in the church, and others.

A pot-luck lunch will be served in the park after the services, Mr. Splett said, and a program of recreation has been arranged for the afternoon.

Zion church was organized on Mar. 30, 1900, under the direction of the late Rev. E. F. Scherbel. That summer, the construction of a new church was started at 523 E. Washington ave. The cornerstone was laid on Nov. 4, 1900, and the new church was dedicated on Apr. 21, 1901.

Then, in 1919, the church was placed on wheels and moved to its present location on Division st. The building was remodeled in 1940.
