Kenosha Girl, 2 Men Face Burglary Charges

MINNEAPOLIS—(P)—A Kenosha county, Wis., girl and two young men faced court appearances on burglary charges Tuesday after raids police said netted them more than \$8,000 in Minnesota.

Jailed here were Mrs. Joyce Holst, Camp Lake (Kenosha county), Wis., and Robert Robinson, Elmhurst, Ill. In jail at Medalia, Minn., was Edward McNally, Chicago. All three are 18 years old.

Police said the trio was captured a week ago at Spencer, Ia., when their stolen car, full of loot, developed trouble. Two homes here were looted Aug. 20 of silverware, furs, jewelry, and rugs. At Medalia, the three admitted breaking into six business places.

Mrs. Holst told police she intended to marry Robinson and that the
