# Portage Bridge Contract Approved

Gov. Rennebohm approved five highway and bridge contracts Friday, including a \$216,983 project for a bridge and an overhead near Portage on State Highway 33.  
 A fixed bridge will be built to replace a swing span over the Portage canal. The overhead will span the Milwaukee road tracks on
