Comedy and Drama

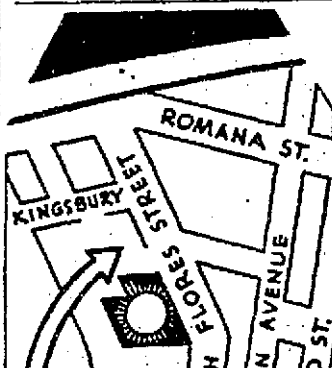
