## Early Completion of Belt Line Crossings Seen

The state highway department hopes to complete two proposed grade separations on the South Madison belt line highway next year, the department's construction engineer, A. T. Bleck, told the state Public Service Commission (PSC) Tuesday afternoon.

Bleck was the only man to testify before the PSC on the two structures to be built in the town of Madison. There was no opposition.

One is a highway overpass on Highway 12, the new belt line, to cross the Chicago and North Western railway tracks about 400 feet south of the present overhead on E. Badger rd.

The other is a subway to take Highways 13 and 14 under the North Western tracks about 500 feet south of the present structure. Highways 13 and 14 are being relocated for part of their length and will pass beneath Highway 12 at an interchange about a quarter-mile from the railroad.

The grade separations will be paid for from state and federal funds.

Bleck said that the grade separations would have to be put in before much of the grading on that section of the belt line is done.
