Edgar Bergen Program, KTSA,

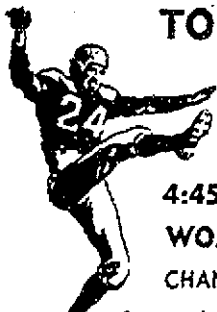
