Blackwood

When you are sitting on declarer's right, it is not so hard to make a necessary second hand high play—when the card you need to go up with is the ace.

It requires considerably more fortitude and imagination, however, to go up with the king in a similar situation.

North dealer.
Neither side vulnerable.
North (Miss Brash)
♠—Q 7
♥—J 7 6
♦—Q 9 4 3
♣—A K J 10

West (Mr. Dale) E (Masters)
♠—8 6 5 3 ♠—10 9 4 2
♥—Q 9 5 4 2 ♥—K 3
♦—A 6 ♦—K 8 2
♣—8 4 ♣—Q 6 5 3

South (Mr. Champion)
♠—A K J
♥—A 10 8

The bidding:
North East South West
1 ♣ Pass 2 NT Pass
3 NT All Pass

In today's deal Mr. Dale opened with the four of hearts and Mr. Masters' king fell to the ace. Now it was clear to Mr. Champion that if the club finesse worked he could win four clubs, two hearts, and three spades, for game.

On the other hand if the club finesse were wrong, then he would have to win at least one diamond trick. And that would involve letting the enemy in twice.

He assumed from the opening lead that Mr. Dale had a long heart suit which, at this point, was just one step from being set up.

But if Mr. Dale had only one of the high diamond honors and that honor could be knocked out promptly, then the heart suit would no longer be a threat.

Accordingly, Mr. Champion went to the board with the ace of clubs and casually led back the trey of diamonds. Without a metry
