\$30,000 Suit Filed Against Gas Firm

Mr. and Mrs. Irving J. Maurer, 4121 Cherokee dr., filed suit in circuit court Thursday afternoon asking \$30,000 damages from the Madison Gas and Electric Co. for injuries suffered by Mrs. Maurer and damage to their home caused by a gas-burning furnace explosion on May 2, 1948.

The Maurers claim the gas company was negligent in installing the gas burner, and that the firm's service men improperly repaired the furnace less than a month before the explosion.
