tary draft and denounce congress-men as "traitors to God and his men as "traitors to God and hu-manity" for passing the selective manity 101 service law.

The sons—Joel, 24, Orin, 23, Sidney, 21, and Paul, 22—have been indicted by a federal grand jury for violation of the selective service act in refusing to register. "The act is unconstitutional, and a shameful attent to destroy the act is unconstitutional, and a shameful attempt to destroy the moral dignity and rights of man,"
