DIAL LITES — TONIGHT

- 6:30—KNX—**Douglas Fairbanks Jr. stars as "Monsieur Beaucaire" in an adaptation of Booth Tarkington's period tale of love, adventure and intrigue in English high society. This is a "Hallmark Playhouse" presentation.
- 7:00—KNX—**"Pioneer '51" is a documentary drama starring newscaster Edward R. Murrow. Together with a supporting cast he will draw a parallel between the early development of the west and the present-day homebuilding in Israel.
- 8:30—KHJ—**Gen. Mark Clark, commanding general of the Army ground forces, will be interviewed during "Reporters' Round-up." The broadcast originates from Gen. Clark's Fort Monroe, Va., headquarters to which he returned from a survey of conditions in the Korean theater.
- 8:30—KFI—**Father discovers that his family is hoarding savings for some secret purpose, and, not realizing that it is to buy him a birthday gift, he jumps to unfortunate conclusions in "The Aldrich Family" comedy.
