STUDENT MURDERS FRATERNITY BROTHER

TUSCALOOSA, Ala., April 2—(UP) A shy, teetotaling college student told police today he was "not sorry" he shot his hard-drinking fraternity brother roommate to death after being kept awake all night by a wild party attended by several co-eds.

The shooting took place yesterday afternoon one block from Fraternity Row on the University of Alabama campus. Luther (Jack) Veazey, 28-year-old freshman from Greenville, Miss., died after being shot five times. He had been riding a bicycle down a sidewalk.

"I am not sorry I did it," said James Ludwig Colvin, 24, a senior from Lincoln, Ala., who was jailed on a murder charge. "Under the circumstances I think it was justified."
