The largest steam turbines are around 150,000 kilowatts, whereas the largest reciprocating steam engines are about 7,500 kilowatts. Their efficiency is approximately 18 per cent, less than half that of the turbines. The largest commercial sized Diesel engine, for driving AC electrical generators, is about 6000 kilowatts.
