Traffic Death Toll Declines in Quarter

Traffic accidents caused 148 deaths in Wisconsin during the first quarter of 1951, compared to 214 victims in the same period last year, the state motor vehicle department said Tuesday.

Thirty-four pedestrians were killed during the period this year, the lowest death toll in the past 12 years. Fifty-five of the victims were pedestrians in the first four months of 1950, the department said.
