Mickey Cohen Bubbles Confidence in Tax Trial

LOS ANGELES—(UP)—Mickey Cohen—occupation, gambler, figured Sunday the odds would be in his favor when he goes to trial today on income tax evasion charges.

"It's a pleasure to walk into a courtroom with a clear conscience," Cohen said. "It will turn out all right."

The ex-newsboy from Los Angeles' east side is accused of evading \$156,000 in taxes in 1946, 1947, and 1948.

"Show me where I earned \$50 that I didn't pay income tax on and I'll plead guilty," Cohen said, repeating the statement he made before the grand jury that indicted him.
