# EX-MIAMI SHERIFF INDICTED IN TAX CASE

MIAMI, Fla., July 16 — (AP) Indictment of former Sheriff Jimmy Sullivan, his wife and three other persons on income tax evasion charges were announced today.

"Smilin' Jimmy" and his wife appeared at the U. S. marshal's office a short time later and posted \$5,000 bonds.

The other indictments, returned by a federal grand jury Friday out kept secret until today, were against Miami Beach City Councilman William Burbridge; Gordon Williams of Fort Lauderdale, Fla., and Dr. Albert H. Mouradian of Miami.

Sullivan, who resigned his \$13,000-a-year Dade County sheriff's post June 18, was charged with evading U. S. income taxes totaling \$12,070 for 1946 and 1947.

Another indictment accused Sullivan and his wife, Ethel, of evading \$4,863 in taxes for 1948.
