Dean Milk Co. Raises Prices

The Dean Milk Co., Chicago, has raised prices on homogenized milk and coffee, whipping, and sour cream, Madison retail outlets were notified Monday.

New prices are 19 cents per quart and 37 cents a half-gallon for homogenized milk, increases of 1 and 2 cents respectively, with prices increased on cream from one to two cents.

The increases are comparable to price hikes announced recently by Madison dairies.

Dean milk is sold only through retail stores in Madison.
