Health Authorities to Study State's Water Fluoridation

Fluoridation installations in 13 Wisconsin cities will be visited Wednesday and Thursday by more than 40 state dental directors, consultants, sanitary engineers, and other health program representatives from 21 states and Washington, D. C.

The water fluoridation conference, sponsored by the state board of health, will open at the Hotel Loraine today at 8 p.m.

The purpose of the meeting is to show the fluoridation installations to out-of-state health workers, since Wisconsin leads the nation in its number of installations for the prevention of dental decay.

The cities to be visited by the conference group are Madison, Crestwood, Oregon, Middleton, Evansville, Janesville, Ft. Atkinson, Watertown, Mayville, Fond du Lac, Sheboygan, Port Washington and Menomonee Falls.
