## Senator Takes Senator as Wife in East

CONCORD, N. H. —(AP)— The senator took a senator for his wife in the crowded New Hampshire senate chamber.

More than 700 guests—including Gov. and Mrs. Sherman Adams and the majority of senate and house members—jam-packed the chamber for the wedding of State Sen. Winifred Wild, 53, and State Sen. George W. Tarlson, 46. Both are Republicans.

The ceremony, performed by the Rev. Oscar Polhemus, pastor of the Haverhill, Mass., Methodist church, was the first capitol nuptials in this state's history. It also was the first time two state senators ever married each other while in office.
