## 2 Hunters Stranded on Mississippi Rescued

LA CROSSE — (AP) — Helger Smith and his 15-year-old son, Richard, stranded on an island in the Mississippi river while hunting Saturday, were rescued late Saturday night.

Smith, of La Crosse, and his son set out early Saturday morning in a rowboat towing a hunting skiff. While hunting in a back area 7 miles northwest of here their rowboat became frozen in and they rowed the skiff to an island about half a mile across a wide channel from where their car was parked on the Minnesota side.

Heavy winds whipped the channel so they decided to spend the night on the island. They set the skiff up as a windbreak and built a big fire.

Mrs. Smith became worried when the two failed to return home and she drove with neighbor to where her husband's car was parked and saw the fire across the water. Then she summoned police, who had Arnold Schwartz and Charles Humfeld, both of La Crosse, row across the channel
