State's 1951 Fall Pig Crop Shows Increase

WASHINGTON — (AP) — Wisconsin's 1951 fall pig crop was 1,319,000 head, the agriculture department reported Thursday.

That compares with 1,290,000 last year.

The 1950 and 1951 figures respectively for Michigan were 667,000 and 718,000, and for Minnesota 1,961,000 and 1,976,000.
