## Milwaukee to Recruit Police Outside City

MILWAUKEE — (UP) — The Milwaukee Police department Monday began a drive to recruit new officers from outside the city for the first time in the department's history.

Police Chief John Polcyn said recruiting in Milwaukee has failed to fill 55 vacancies in the force and now qualified applicants from any part of Wisconsin will be accepted.

Polcyn said the statewide recruiting would be on an "experimental" basis at first.

Applicants must be between 23 and 33 years old and at least five feet, eight inches tall. They must pass physical and mental tests before the force will accept them.
