Madison Firm Sued for \$133,311 Damages

The A. S. Schulman Electric Co., Chicago, filed suit in Madison federal court Monday to recover \$133,311 damages from **John Urse** and **Julius Ruskin**, Madison, for alleged breach of contract.

The Madison men, under the name of **Capitol Tree Experts**, 1006 Merrill Springs rd., entered into a contract at \$50,000 to clear a right of way for a 52-mile transmission line between **Wood River** and **Vandalia, Ill.**, but abandoned the job after completing only one mile, the complaint said.

The Schulman firm alleged it was compelled to complete the job at a cost of \$176,961. **Gordon Sinykin** of **LaFollette**, **Sinykin**, and **Doyle**, is Madison attorney for the plaintiff.
