Ban on Yellow Oleo in New York Lifted

ALBANY, N. Y. — (U.P.) — Gov. Thomas E. Dewey signed into law Tuesday a bill permitting sale of yellow oleomargarine.

The law lifts a 66-year-old state ban on the pre-colored product. It goes into effect July 1.

Assemblywoman Genesta M. Strong, sponsor of the bill, and Sen. Stanley J. Bauer of Buffalo, who had a companion measure in the upper house, witnessed the signing in Dewey's offices.

Approval of the measure by the legislature last week climaxed a four-year battle by gray-haired Mrs. Strong, Plandome, N. Y. Republican. The legislation was strongly opposed by the state's \$4,000,000,000 dairy industry leaders.
