Gill Garage Acquires Hudson Agency Here

The Gill Garage, Inc., 13 S. Webster st., has acquired the Hudson automobile agency in Madison and will begin operation about Apr. 15. Chester L. Gill, president and general manager, said Monday night.

Parking facilities will be cut from 250 to about 200 cars to accommodate the new agency, but the garage will still handle regular customers and provide transient parking on a "limited scale" Gill said.

The two police ambulances will be housed in the police garage across the street since Gill's will be closed at 1 a. m. each day.

Eau Claire Firm Gets Federal Tax Benefit

WASHINGTON.—(AP)—The Defense Production Administration (DPA) Tuesday announced its approval of federal tax benefits for 587 defense plant expansion projects involving proposed outlays of \$958,155,000.

One of the new "certificates of a necessity" is for the United States Rubber Co., \$5,292,700 for military tire production at Eau Claire, Wis. Sixty-five per cent of the certified outlay was declared eligible for the tax privilege.
