Oregon Farmer Asks \$18,777 in Son's Death

Harvey J. Hawkinson Sr., Route 1, Oregon farmer, filed suit in Circuit Court Tuesday afternoon asking \$18,777 for the death of his son, Harvey Jr., who was killed last Nov. 3 when his farm tractor struck a parked car on a town road between Oregon and Highway 106.

Defendants in the suit are Russell E. DeBrock, Stoughton, a state conservation warden, owner of the parked car, and his insurers, the Hartford Accident and Indemnity Co.
