## 450 Expected Here for Barber Union's 50th Anniversary

An estimated 450 barbers and beauty culturists are expected to gather in Madison June 22 for a three-day 18th annual convention, and to help Madison Barbers Local 153 celebrate its 50th anniversary.

Sam J. Fedele, state second vice-president, and secretary-treasurer of the Madison local, said the convention headquarters will be in the Park hotel. Thirty delegates are slated to attend from the state.

William C. Birthright, Indianapolis, international president of the Barber and Beauty Culture Association, will be principal speaker at the convention banquet.

A panel discussion among representatives of the Adult Education and Vocational school, the Federal Apprenticeship training program and the State Board of Health, will be a convention feature.

## 2,153 Cars Checked in Safety Campaign

A total of 2,153 was checked during Madison's recent safety lane operation, it was announced Thursday at a meeting of the Madison Auto Dealers Association by Archie Hirst, executive secretary.

The dealers sponsored the lane in cooperation with the Madison police department, and Wisconsin Motor Vehicle Department.

The inspections revealed defective headlights on 411 cars, bad brakes on 227 cars, unsafe glass on 151, and poor wheel alignment on 45, Hirst said.

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
