## Stopping of Trucks for Weight Check Legal, Judge Says

GREEN BAY —(AP)— Stopping a truck for a routine weight check does not constitute unlawful search and seizure, Judge Raymond Rahr held in a decision filed here Monday.

The judge said the action is specifically authorized by statute. He was acting in the case of State vs. Cobodas Brothers Co. of Wisconsin, charged with exceeding the legal axle weight on one of its trucks.

Last Nov. 14, State Traffic Inspector Ed Pohan, Green Bay, ordered the truck off the road onto a highway scale at DePere. Pohan said he had no reason to suspect the truck, but was making a routine check. A 3,600-pound overload on the rear axle was discovered.

The defense attorney said that a section of the state motor vehicle law permits an officer to stop a truck if he has reason to suspect an overload, but that otherwise such stopping constitutes illegal search and seizure.

Judge Rahr said in his decision that another section authorizes inspectors to stop a motor vehicle at any time. He also held that a corporation cannot invoke the constitution, since it is a creature of the statute.

Sentence will be imposed July 29.
