Army Worms Back Again

Pests Hit Alfalfa, Ag Agent Reports

Army worms which caused such damage in Dane county oat fields during the summer are making a second appearance — this time in new alfalfa seedlings. J. W. (Bill) Clark, Dane county agricultural agent said Monday.

He said there were several badly infested fields near Waunakee where the worms chewed off volunteer oats and destroyed the new alfalfa seedlings.

Clark told farmers that where the worms were thick in new seedlings it will probably pay to poison them this fall.

"If weather conditions are right in 1953 be on the lookout for heavy outbreaks of the pests in the small grain because of this year's big build-up in numbers," Clark said.

He said it would not pay to spray in order to prevent next year's outbreak unless every infested field were sprayed. The worms winter either as pupa or larvae.
