2 Whisky Thieves Jailed; Cafe Man Fined for Conduct

Two 17-year-old Madison boys were sent to jail to await sentence for burglarizing whisky from the Blackhawk Country Club, and a Park st. restaurant operator was fined in Superior Court Monday afternoon for contributing to the delinquency of one of the boys.

Charles Linken, 35, of 2121 Taft st., operator of the Castle restaurant, paid a \$100 and costs fine for contributing to the delinquency of one of the boys by giving him beer and engaging in immoral activities.

The two boys pleaded guilty to climbing in an unlocked window at the Blackhawk Country Club last Wednesday and stealing 16 bottles of whisky valued at \$64.

They drank all but one bottle of whisky, Asst. Dist. Atty. Glenn Henry said.
