N. C. Negro Convicted of Assault by 'Leering'

YANCEYVILLE, N. C. (AP)—An all-white jury convicted Negro sharecropper Mack Ingram Tuesday of assault by "leering" at a young white girl at a distance of 60 feet.

The jury of rural farmers took only 58 minutes to convict the lanky, 45-year-old father of nine children under a law which provides that actual physical contact has no bearing on assault if the defendant intended harm.

Under the conviction, Ingram faces a prison sentence up to two

years. Sentence will be passed today.

Ingram's attorneys have said they will appeal the conviction.
