## Russ Should Be Ousted from UN, Tobey Says

UNITED NATIONS, N. Y. (AP)—Sen. Charles Tobey (R-N.H.) suggested Tuesday that the way for the United Nations (UN) to treat the Russians is to "kick them out." Tobey said he "thanked God" that President-Elect Dwight D. Eisenhower is "a man who can tell Joe Stalin when to get off."

The Bible-quoting senator reminded a news conference of Isaiah's admonition: "Come, let us reason together."

"But how are you going to reason together with people who won't reason?" he asked, concerning the Russians.

"What we should be doing is going to them and saying 'we are telling you, not asking you—if you can't play ball, get out!'"

Tobey reiterated that if the Russians refused to cooperate in overcoming the East-West stalemate within the UN, "we should kick them out."

## FBI Holds Milwaukee Man for Rail Thefts

MINNEAPOLIS (UP)—The FBI arrested George McLemore, 40, Milwaukee, Tuesday on suspicion of stealing from the clothes of sleeping passengers on the Milwaukee Road's transcontinental "Columbian."

McLemore was taken off the train here on complaint of railroad detectives. FBI agents said McLemore planned to ride the train to Tacoma, Wash., and rifle the clothes of passengers during the night.
