As a result, a 12-year-old school text book is going to be corrected. Dave also has an acknowledgment from the publisher.

Dave, a second-grader, knows his trucks. And when he saw a picture of a self-propelled crane in the text book, he got after the publisher.

The picture showed the crane lumbering down a street to a basement excavation job. This aroused Dave.

"A shovel like that couldn't go down the street. It would ruin the street," he wrote the publisher. "That kind of a shovel is carried where it is going by a truck."

The publishers, Scott, Foresman and Company of Chicago, conceded that Dave was right. They told him so in a letter of reply. There will be a correct picture in the book's next edition, they said.
