BELLEFONTAINE, O. (AP) — A probate court jury here awarded Clem Hover of nearby Lakeview a reimbursement totaling \$1 when he refused to allow county engineers easement of his land to complete extension of a sanitary sewer line. He was his own attorney at the trial.
