## Blast in Building Injures 11 in Frisco

SAN FRANCISCO (U.P.) — A violent basement explosion literally ripped a three-story building to pieces in the heart of Chinatown Wednesday, injuring 11 men, two of them seriously.

The blast touched off a fire that consumed what was left of the building and threatened for a time to become a major conflagration in the congested Chinese colony.

Fire department officials said the blast was caused by accumulated gas from a leaking butane tank in the building's basement.

The era-splitting blast tossed huge chunks of concrete clear
