67 GIs Suffocated in Sealed Bunkers, Marines Disclose

TOKYO (AP)— An estimated 67 American Marines died of suffocation when Chinese artillery smashed their bunkers on Vegas Hill and sealed them underground amid choking powder fumes, it was disclosed Tuesday.

Three survivors, dug out and captured by the Communists who overran the western front outpost Mar. 16, told of their "snake pit" ordeal in hospitals here Tuesday.

The survivors, liberated in the prisoner exchange, are Navy Hospital Corpsman Thomas Waddill, 20, Ft. Worth, Tex.; Marine Cpl. Jimmie E. Lacey, 19, Texarkana, Tex., and Marine Pfc. Richard L. Oven, Buffalo, N. Y.

Waddill said 41 men died in his bunker and only six survived. Oven said 26 men died and four survived in a nearby bunker. The men died from noxious fumes and a lack of oxygen.

Only three Marines were moving around in his bunker after the shelling stopped, Waddill said.
