# 67 GIs Suffocated in Sealed Bunkers. Marines Disclose

TOKYO IP— An estimated 87 American Marines died of suffoca-tion when Chinese artillery smash-ed their bunkers on Vegas Hill ed their bushers on veges 12.1 and scaled them underground amid choking powder fumes, it was dis-closed Tuesday.
