NBC's Hicks Puts Interview on Tape Here

George Hicks, one of the National Broadcasting Co.'s (NBC) top special-events announcers, was in Madison on Wednesday to record an interview with Noble Clark which will be broadcast Sunday, May 31.

For only the fifth time in eight years, Hicks will miss doing a "live" broadcast of the intermission feature of "Theater Guild on the Air" over NBC-WIBA at 7:30 p. m. that Sunday. He missed three shows because of illness and recorded a fourth.

Before putting the interview on tape, Hicks toured the University of Wisconsin agriculture campus with Clark, who is associate director of the university experiment station.
