Ike Relaxes and Catches Some Trout

(From United Press, Associated Press) CUSTER STATE PARK, S. D.—President Eisenhower had a "whale of a time" trout fishing Friday and demonstrated his luck by hooking two 12-inch specimens as photographers snapped pictures.

The chief executive spent a sportive day in the sun, plowing through French creek in hip waders.

Eisenhower and a small White House staff are staying at the state game lodge until this morning. The rustic lodge is the same one at which President Calvin Coolidge vacationed in 1927.

Shortly after Eisenhower left, the White House denied in Washington a report from Seoul that the President had sent a new message to President Syngman Rhee of South Korea, urging him to support the impending armistice.

Later in the day, the President said he honestly hopes the prisoner of war agreement reached at Panmunjom "will speedily lead to an armistice and just peace in Korea and to a relaxing of world tensions."

He made the statement in a letter to Prime Minister Nehru of India.

The President is scheduled to fly today to New Hampshire.

Pole Gets 5 Years for Spying Against U.S.

LINZ, Austria (UP)—A 29-year-old Pole was sentenced Friday to five years imprisonment for spying against the U. S. Army in Austria on behalf of the Czechoslovak intelligence service.

Henryk Jan Cziurczyk admitted in a U. S. civil affairs court that he gathered reports on refugees at the U. S. refugee center at Wels.
