## Part of State St. to Be Closed for Resurfacing Job

Sections of State st., from the capitol square to N. Park st., will be closed to traffic this week while the street is resurfaced, the mayor's office announced Friday.

The sections of the street which are actually in the process of being paved will be closed to traffic officials said. The remainder of the street will be open to traffic and buses.

The street will be given a new asphalt covering as a part of the city's county highway aid projects for the year.

Bus service along State will be rerouted during the week, but the routings will change as the work progresses, according to the mayor's office.

It was also announced that Regent st., from S. Park st. to Monroe st., will be closed in sections during the week of July 6-11, while a new asphalt surface is applied there.

## Wholesale Prices Drop Last Week

WASHINGTON (UPI)—Average wholesale prices declined slightly in the week ended June 16, mainly because of a decline in farm products and processed foods, the Bureau of Labor Statistics reported Friday.

The bureau said wholesale prices fell three-tenths of one per cent to put the wholesale index at 109.3 per cent of 1947-49 prices.
