Gov. Walter Kohler's office Friday released contracts for three state and four county trunk highways totaling \$324,316. All are scheduled for completion this year.

The contracts by counties:

Brown — Grading and bituminous surfacing of .9 mile of Broadway ave. in De Pere by the Reliance Construction Co., Sheboygan, for \$110,368.

Rock — Construction of black-top approaches to a new bridge over Marsh Creek on U. S. 14 near Janesville for \$11,717.

Iowa — Resurfacing of 13 miles of County Trunk H near Ridgeway and Arena for \$88,931.

Waupaca — Reconstruction of 3.3 miles of County Trunk D near Clintonville for \$58,695.

Outagamie — Reconstruction of County Trunk S near Freedom for \$32,533.

Polk — Grading and base course of the air base road near Farmington for \$22,072.
