## Cardinal Spellman Aids ROK Rescue

EASTERN FRONT, Korea, Saturday (U.P.) — Francis Cardinal Spellman helped pull injured South Korean soldiers from an overturned jeep Friday after it skidded off an icy road.

The 64-year-old Catholic prelate left his own jeep and walked through snow and sleet to aid in rescuing the trapped ROKs, who were not seriously injured.

Their jeep overturned just in front of Cardinal Spellman's motor convoy.

Well bundled in Army winter clothes, the church leader insisted on making the four and a half-hour jeep trip in freezing weather after a Christmas Day fog grounded his light airplane.

He rode over rough, slippery roads to the U. S. 45th Division, but the weather and the accident delayed his arrival and a scheduled mass.
