Son, Son-in-Law of Injured Woman Admit Family Row

A son and son-in-law of Mrs. Ben Mickelson, 69, Route 2, Sun Prairie, pleaded guilty in Superior Court Tuesday to charges involving their part in a family fight in which Mrs. Mickelson was severely injured Sunday night.

The son-in-law, K. Merle Johnson, 44, Sun Prairie, admitted striking Mrs. Mickelson and was sent to jail to await sentence on assault and battery charges.

The son, Robert G. Mickelson, 40, Sun Prairie, was sent to jail to await sentence on disorderly conduct charges for hitting his younger brother, Kenneth, 35.

Asst. Dist. Atty. William Byrne said Mrs. Mickelson was struck when she tried to stop the two older men from fighting with Kenneth. She was reported in "satisfactory" condition Tuesday night at Methodist hospital where she is being treated for a fractured nose, two black eyes, and other bruises.
