ON W-G-N.

A speech by President Roosevelt, introduction of a new series of script programs and a brilliant concert with special music by the W-G-N concert orchestra will highlight W-G-N's programs for today.

President Roosevelt will be heard at 9:30 p. m. on a special program in the interests of the "Mobilization for Human Needs" campaign. The President will talk from Washington and in addition the music of the Pittsburgh Symphony orchestra and a talk by Charles P. Taft also will be heard. Also on WBBM, WCFL, and WENR.

At 9 p. m. Henry Weber and the W-G-N Concert orchestra will present the regular weekly "Pageant of Melody" program. Mr. Weber will present the brilliant "Rio Grande" suite, by Constant Lambert, written especially for strings, drums and solo piano which part will be played by W-G-N's staff pianist Leon Benditzky. "Rio Grande" never has been broadcast over W-G-N and the Mutual Network and has only been played twice in this country. Mr. Weber has augmented the W-G-N orchestra for this special program, the percussion section of the orchestra alone being increased to five musicians.

"Lady of Millions," a new script show starring May Robson, will be heard on its premiere performance at 3:15 p. m.
