[Central Daylight Saving Time.]

Lieut. Gen. Hugh A. Drum, veteran of the Spanish-American and world wars, will speak from 10:15 to 10:45 p. m. over W-G-N and the coast to coast Mutual network in a special address preliminary to the army maneuvers at Canton, N. Y. The program will originate in the studio of WLSB at Ogdensburg, N. Y., near Canton. The speech will be directed to the thousand or more officers assembled in the area for participation in the 1st army—2d corps area maneuvers. Gen. Drum went to France in 1917 as Gen. Pershing's assistant chief of staff and later became chief of staff of the 1st army.

Capt. E. D. C. Herne, former British flyer, will present his regular evening review of the news from 6:30 to 6:45 p. m.

Kathryn Witwer, soprano, and Attilio Baggione, tenor, will be featured on Henry Weber's "Pageant of Melody" from 9:15 to 10 p. m. Miss Witwer and Baggione will be highlighted in a duet from the first act of "Carmen." "Le Roi la dit," by Clement Dellbes, "Angelus," by Jules Massenet, and "Southern Roses Waltz," by Richard Strauss, will be played by the W-G-N Concert orchestra.

At 9:45 a. m., June Baker will interview Edwin McArthur, noted musical director and conductor, for Kirsten Flagstad.

At 8:45 tonight W-G-N and the coast to coast Mutual network will present the coaching staff of the College All-Star football team, as selected by popular vote of the fans, in a special broadcast, which will feature Arch Ward, sports editor of THE CHICAGO TRIBUNE and director of the All-Star game, and Bob Elson, W-G-N-Mutual's sports commentator, as well as the field coaches.
