East might have taken the p to consider the bidding. South's ding had guaranteed a maximum of four cards in the minor s. Whether these were three clubs one diamond, or two clubs and diamonds, did not matter. The sal fact was that East could not hope to take more than one diamond trick. That being so, he should have grabbed it in a hurry, because it was, of course, a strong possibility that South had only three minor cards, which could go on dummy clubs. East's one reasonable l was that after he had taken the
