# Flambeau to Be Permanently Wild, Forested Recreation Area



Miles of shoreline on the north and south forks of the Flambeau river, one of the most famous cause streams of the middle west, shown in the picture above, have been included in the boundary of a permanent state forest, and recreation area, under plans approved by the conservation commission and announced today.

The Sawyer county borad has informally approved efforts to the commission to bring a substantial area along the Flambeau under state ownership so it can be per-

anently dedicated to public recreational use. In 1933 the state acquired

about 800 acres of virgin forest land along the north fork of the river and associated with this property are approximately 2,100 acres of trust fund virgin forest land now under control of the land commission.

At a recent meeting the conservation commission approved a program of consolidating the present state holdings to take in a relatively large area of forested land, well suited to recreational


