Don't Drink, Smoke, Dempsey Tells Youth

WASHINGTON — (U.P.) — Jack Dempsey, former world heavyweight boxing champion, testifying before a congressional committee Thursday, advised young boys and girls to abstain from liquor and smoking, and believed the present crop of boxers:
"Don't meet the standards of the old timers."
Dempsey appeared before a senate interstate commerce subcommittee to urge approval of legislation to lift the present prohibition against the interstate shipment of prize fight movie films. A battery of cameras ground out the record of his testimony.

The former champ, now a New York restaurant owner, sat beside Sen. W. Warren Barbour, (R., N. J.), who was once ranking heavyweight in the amateur ring. Barbour is the author of a bill to repeal the movie ban.

Confessions of a NAZI SPY
