Williams Still Tops DiMaggio

DETROIT—Red Williams is still topping Joe DiMaggio. Joe came to bat in the ninth inning of the ninth annual All-Star game here with one out, the bases loaded, the American League nine on the worrying end of a 5-3 score, and the chance to achieve something even greater than his record-breaking hitting streak tossed into his lap.

But, alas, Joe is not superhuman. This time he failed. Forcing Cecil Travis of the Senators at second with a weak roller to short, on which he was saved the ignominy of being doubled at first by a wide throw, Joe stood on first and watched Ted Williams, the only man he looks up to as a hitter, slam one of Claude Passeau's pitches against the top of the right field grand stand for a home run that furnished a storybook ending for the looziest and at the same time one of the most dramatic All-Star games ever played.

This time it was DiMaggio who stood on home plate to congratulate the hero. The American League had won the ball game, 7-5, thanks to Williams' prodigious poke, after it seemed that Arky Vaughn of the Pirates had sewed it up beyond redemption with homers in the seventh and eighth, good for two runs each. No other ball player in All-Star game history had made two home runs in one game. But Arky's feat, unique though it was, was forgotten when the long, lean lead from Boston propelled his ash club against Passeau's last pitch.

If a goat is needed in a victory as heroic as that which Williams' bat wrought, hang the hated horns on the brow of Billy Herman of the Dodgers, whose wide throw to first in the ninth on DiMaggio's roller to short ruined an easy double play that would have ended the ball game without giving Ted the Terrible his mighty last whack.

When I say the ball game was loose, I mean as loose as Fuller's Earth, not just ashes. Briggs Stadium's emerald expanse is pitted with man-sized divots made by outfielders who flipper, sat down and stumbled by turns. If

It was so contagious that skeptics in the crowd were beginning to wonder if the boys fell or were pushed. Leo Durocher wasn't out there to do any slipping but he suffered a mental lapse in the third while coaching on first when he let Linus Frey get caught flat-footed by Feller's tricky motion and saw him thrown out at second.

The American League didn't seem to want the ball game until the last inning. Del Baker sent out Sid Hudson of the Senators in the seventh and with a few motions of his arm this young man undid the good work of Bob Feller and Thornton Lee, who had preceded him. The first of Vaughn's homers was made off Sid and it followed a single by Slaughter. Sid was lucky to escape with two runs damage. Also, he was lucky to escape the anger of the crowd which had begun to get impatient with Baker's strategy by this time and was crying for Mr. Hudson's valet to prepare the bath.

It developed later that Hudson had his finger caught in the door of a taxi cab before the game. It would have been interesting to find this out after the ball game if Williams hadn't produced his payoff pike in the ninth. The incident shows just how much thought is put into master-minding these All-Star games.

Edgar Smith of the White Sox, who was Baker's next choice, was lucky to have had Theodore of the Williams clan on his side or he would have been no bargain, either. The second of Arky's homers was hit off his undeciphering delivery in the eighth, after Johnny Mize had nicked him for a double.
